HOT MEALS FOR THE HOMEBOUND

Two to three times per week, our kitchen prepares hot meals for disabled and homebound citizens. Our volunteer teams then deliver these meals to their homes while providing a friendly, caring presence. In 2021, we delivered over 39,000 of these meals.



FOOD BOXES/FOOD PANTRY

Our on-site food pantry supplies food boxes to families in crisis situations, supplies the kitchen with food for walkup meals and New Life client meals, and serves as a hub for the Wiregrass Food Bank in distributing food to outlying agencies.



WALK UP MEALS

Citizens in need are able to receive a hot meal three times a day, seven days a week. This isn't intended to meet a long-term need, but we provide an emergency assistance until a permanent solution can be secured. We also feed our New Life program clients three times a day as well



HOLIDAY MEALS

For Thanksgiving and Christmas, we provide meals either on site or by partnering with local restaurants and agencies to feed those in need.



PRAY FOR OUR **MINISTRY**





Started in 1998, the New Life Recovery Program is a faith based, Christ-centered substance abuse recovery ministry for men and women. Individuals may come through a court referral or on a voluntary basis.

Three Phases of New Life Recovery

PRE-ADMIT

Men or women can choose to enter New Life in a "pre-admission" status. While waiting on the next class to begin, clients begin working, attending devotions and church services, and begin getting acclimated to their daily schedule.



A six-month work/study program utilizing a Gospel centered curriculum designed to help men and women truly break free from drugs and alcohol in their lives. Students also receive job preparation training through the "Ready to Work" program offered by ESCC

AFTERCARE

Upon graduating the six-month program, a New Life client may apply to enter Aftercare where they spend up to a year preparing to transition back into society again Clients must have a fulltime job while in Aftercare. They receive money management and job skills training. Housing and meals are provided on site.
